



The Man


- Major General, British Army
- Coldstream Guards
- during the French and Indian War/Seven Year's War Commander in Chief of the British Army in America
- Combat experience Top British Commander but had no previous
- Died 13 July 1755 from wounds received at the Monongahela River






he Situation-1755

- Britain and France fighting over control of North America
- the key to control (site of present day Pittsburgh) French Fort Duquesne at the confluence of the Allegheny and Monongahela River was
- Gen Braddock led 2,100 British troops to take Fort Duquesne
- Massive Army for 1755 North America
- Large contingent of wilderness fighters (Daniel Boone & George Washington)
- Artillery and logistic support
- Built a road to get there
- Winchester VA to Pittsburgh
- **Uncharted wilderness**
- Allegheny Mountains
- Huge systems engineering effort
- Demonstrated
- Leadership
- Intelligence
- Ability
- Attention to detail








What Happened?

- of Pittsburgh (site of present day Braddock PA) Braddock crossed the Monongahela River and led his army to within 10 miles
- Discussed tactics the whole way
- Wilderness fighters (Washington) urged wilderness tactics
- Gen Braddock refused; fight the way he was trained
- Ambushed by 250 French and Indians
 Braddock's Army stood in the open and was destroyed

Gen Braddock was killed

The Army retreated back to Virginia





Lessons?
